The Kindergartners have enjoyed learning the Primary colors Red and Yellow. They had fun mixing red and yellow to make the secondary color of orange. They painted a picture using the orange paint they made.

I have enjoyed getting to know everyone and each individual personality. They are all such precious children.

1st and 2nd Grade

Seventeen children have entered the first and second grade doors with excitement, anxiousness, and anticipation. This year we have seven first graders and ten second graders. We have ten boys and seven girls. So that makes for a wonderful class. They have been working hard and doing their best to get their brains in motion again after the summer vacation.

In Bible, we studied some words of wisdom from James. These words should help us to get along this year:

- 1) Don't argue and fight,
- 2) Be quick to listen and slow to speak,
- 3) Listen to God's word and then do it,
- 4) Be a peacemaker,
- 5) Prayer is powerful and useful.

We put these words up in a corner to help settle things when we disagree.

First graders have begun their first real reading book!! They have reviewed all of the alphabet sounds, so now they are ready to put those sounds together into words!! The second graders keep reading more and more words each day. They have to review the sounds we learned already and then go on to new sounds. The children need to read at home out of their library books. At school we read to our partner, read to ourselves, read as a group, hear stories on tape or from Mrs. Goslinga. All of this reading should help the students become excellent readers.

In Social Studies, the children have learned more about our families. We all have rules to follow at home. They should be getting more duties and responsibilities as they grow older each year. Holidays are special times spent together. Our lives have changed very much with many new inventions like the computer, cell phone, and CD players. We love and enjoy our families.

Summer vacation for Mrs. Goslinga included a weekend in Kansas City. She went to the Harry Truman Presidential Museum and learned more about WWII and Korean War. She also visited Elgin, IL and Milwaukee, WI where she saw the Jelly Belly candy factory and Miller Park where the Milwaukee Brewers play ball. Otherwise, it was fun to take walks, read a book, and do things at a slower pace.

Mrs. Goslinga

7th and 8th Grade

It's been great getting to know the 7th and 8th grades so far this year! I think we learn something new about each other every week and have begun to build a very strong community in the classroom. Here is what we've been up to so far this year and a bit about what's to come!

In math class, both grades have learned about algebraic expressions and how to solve problems with integers. We are currently working through solving equations with variables and will soon look at inequalities by doing some graphing!

For science class, we started off learning about basic safety rules whenever we work with various materials in class. We've also learned about how small and large things are measured and an easy way to write those numbers using scientific notation. We just finished up studying about different substances and mixtures. We will now be taking a deeper look at what matter is and how it can take on different forms.

English class has been a lot of review about the different parts of speech, capitalization and punctuation rules. We've also looked at sentence structure and what essential parts are needed to make a complete sentence. Since we have begun working on narrative stories in writing class, we are looking at all the uses of quotation marks. The very beginning of the year we wrote descriptive essays about a person or place. The next couple weeks we will continue to work on narrative stories.

Bible class has taken us through understanding what the Bible is as a continuous story with God being both character and the author of that story. Through various stories in the Bible, including the patriarchs, judges, and connections to ourselves, we've discovered that God truly wants a relationship with us and will always keep his covenant promises. We will wrap up this unit by looking at how so many people disobeyed God and yet God remains our Savior. Then we will study the different feasts of the Lord that took place in the Old Testament.

In computer class we have brushed up on our typing skills and will continue to make strides in becoming better typers. We've also learned how to format a paper in different ways by changing the margins, font size and style, and spacing. We are now beginning to use Google Apps for certain assignments which allows us to share documents with each other and make revisions from home without having to email it to ourselves.

I really enjoyed teaching this group of kids! If you have any questions or concerns about anything going on in the classroom or with your child, as always, please don't hesitate to contact me!

Other news:

The 5th and 6th graders have learned how and why scientists classify animals into many different groups. The first group we studied 5 different vertebrates including birds, fish, mammals, reptiles, and amphibians. Now we're taking a look at some different invertebrates and seeing how each of them is created so uniquely. One of the main things we've discovered is that God's creation is so awesome!!

We've studied different aspects of our earth and compared the use of a globe versus a map as well as using a key of a map effectively. We explored the geography of Antarctica as well as navigating around North America. Traveling south, we found out interesting facts about South America and will soon be investigating Europe!
