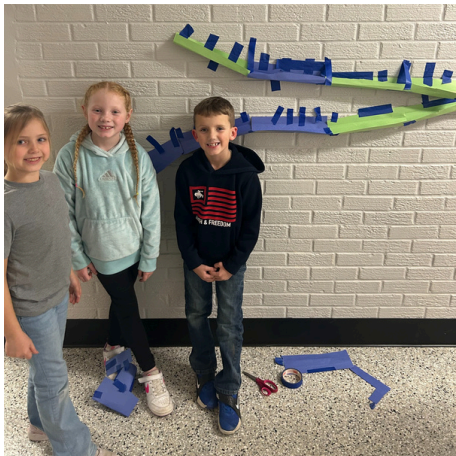

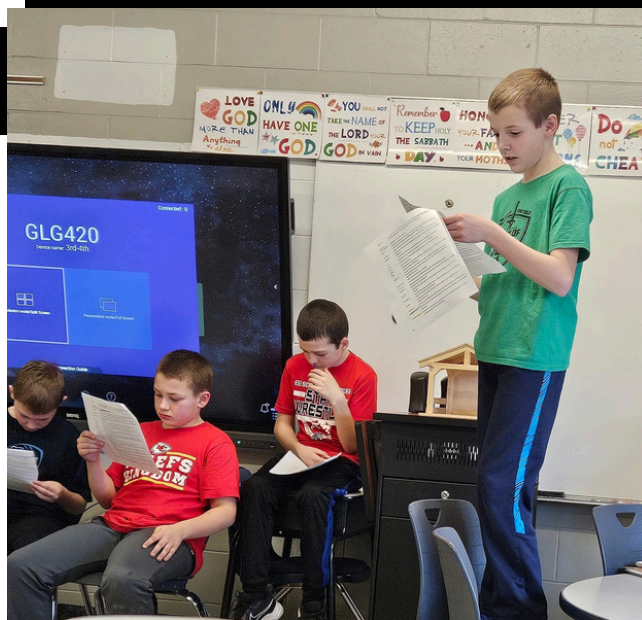

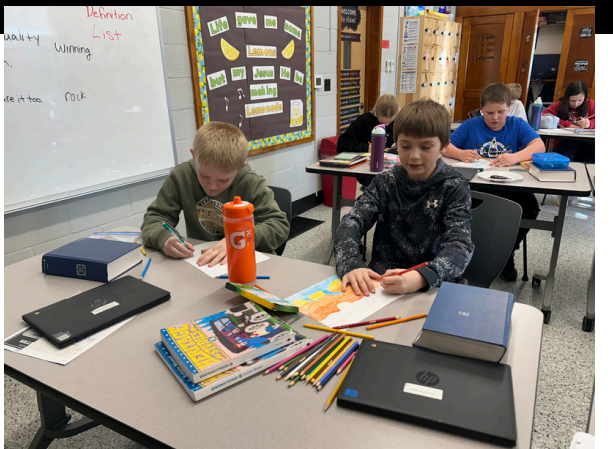

5TH & 6TH GRADE



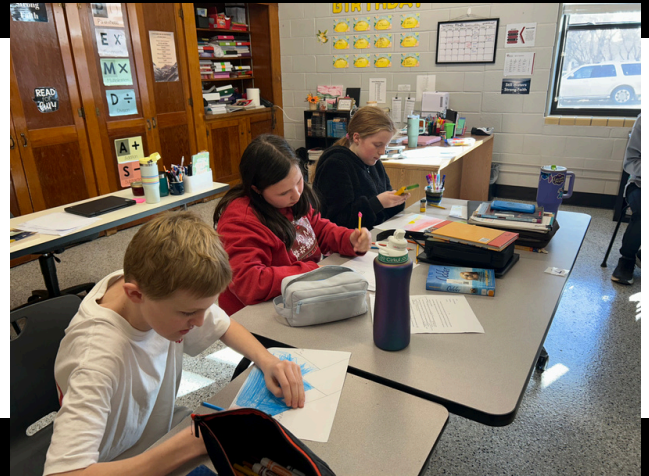
